What is COVID-19? Coronaviruses are a large family of viruses that are common in people and many different species of animals, including camels, cattle, cats, and bats. Rarely, animal coronaviruses can infect people and then spread between people such as with MERS-CoV, SARS-CoV, and now with this new virus (named SARS-CoV-2). Early on, many of the patients at the epicenter of the outbreak in Wuhan, Hubei Province, China had some link to a large seafood and live animal market, suggesting animal-to-person spread. Later, a growing number of patients reportedly did not have exposure to animal markets, indicating person-to-person spread. Person-to-person spread was subsequently reported outside Hubei and in countries outside China, including in the United States. Some international destinations now have apparent community spread with the virus that causes COVID-19, as do some parts of the United States. Community spread means some people have been infected and it is not known how or where they became exposed (www.cdc.org)

Why does Oakley need a task force? Leadership employed during this time will ensure timely dissemination of information to help during this pandemic, wise counsel will aid in the betterment of Oakley, her community, and the future of effective ministry.

Task Force Guidelines and Measures

The safety of our membership is of the utmost importance. Therefore, we are implementing and reiterating the following CDC guidelines:
